This past month has been a very busy one for us. A few fortunate chapter members were able to attend the annual

STC Summit, which is the premier conference for technical communicators. It was held just outside Chicago, and even though NATO dominated the news while we were there, the real action was at the conference. Our chapter was the talk of the Summit when we walked out with the three top prizes in the Community Achievement Awards ceremony, a veritable trifecta of accomplishment.

Your Orlando Central Florida STC Chapter shared the Most Improved Community award with the Toronto Chapter, was recognized a record-setting sixth time as a Chapter of Distinction, and (best for last) closed the ceremony as we were announced to be the Community of the Year. This designation means that of all the chapters and SIGs in the entire international Society for Technical Community, Orlando Central Florida Chapter was Number One, Numero Uno, Top Dog, Best in Show.

These awards reflect and honor the commitment and passion our members bring to the technical communication profession. Congratulations, Orlando Central Florida Chapter! And many thanks to Patricia Cruz, who shepherded the application process from planning to execution to award.

In other Summit news, Dan Voss and Bethany Bowles ably presented at the Summit Leadership Program, sharing information about our mentoring program so other communities can use our program as a model. They also serve on the Society-wide CAC, as does chapter treasurer, Sarah Baca. Debra Johnson, chapter vice-president, participated in a pre-conference certificate program. WC Wiese was recognized for his Board of Directors role as his term of office ended. We know he will be innovating in other avenues of service that will go in directions we cannot even imagine now.

One more item of interest concerning the Summit: While I was there I met two chapter members whom I didn't already know—Alicia Kerns and Jenny Mellquist. I hope we will be seeing more of them at our chapter meetings, now that we've had a chance to become acquainted. I think we have a chance with Alicia, but meeting Jenny at the Summit was probably the closest we're going to come for a while. Jenny, you see, lives in Sweden! Yes, we are an international chapter. Jenny is a former resident of Melbourne, Florida, and when she moved back to Sweden there was no STC chapter at the time so she stayed with us. We're glad to know our most-distant member and
